

ACTION ALERT: Urge your Representative to Support VOCA

The Administration's budget outline for FY 2018, released on March 16, does not include specifics for many programs, including the Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Fund. However, Congress's work to set those numbers has already started.

It is important for you to contact your Representative in the next few days, asking him/her to support VOCA funding—nontaxpayer funds that support crime victim compensation and assistance.

The Co-Chairs of the Congressional Victims' Rights Caucus, Congressmen Ted Poe (R-TX) and Jim Costa (D-CA) are asking their colleagues to [join in a letter](#) to appropriators asking for continued high levels of VOCA funding. **PLEASE CALL YOUR REPRESENTATIVE** and urge them to sign onto this letter.
